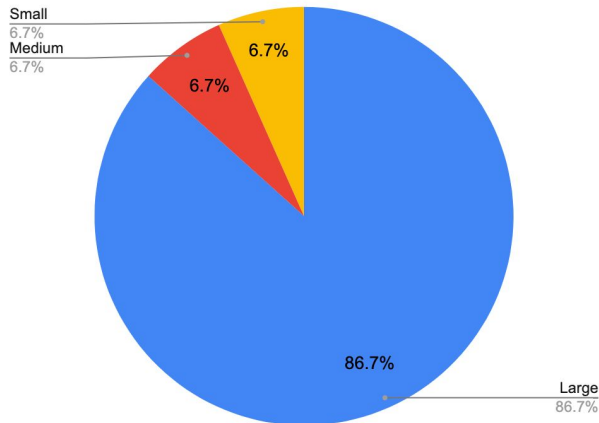


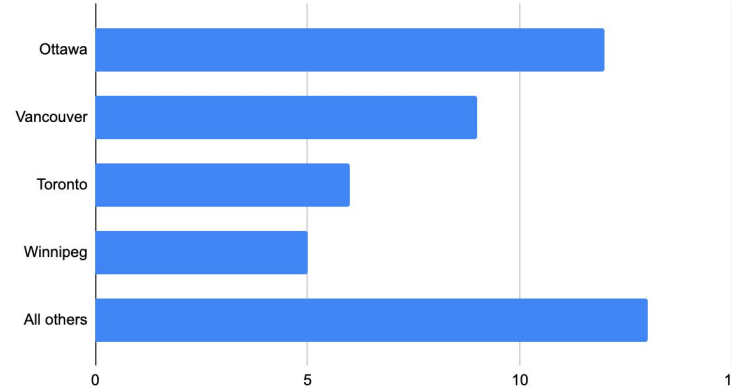
On Rural and Small Municipality Representation in Archivaria

Authors by Municipality Size



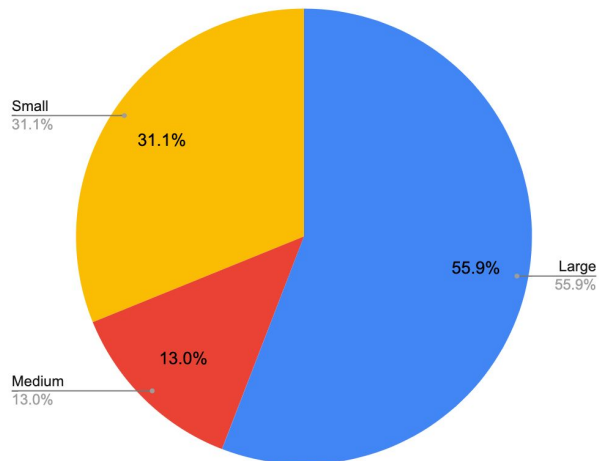
Authors by Municipality



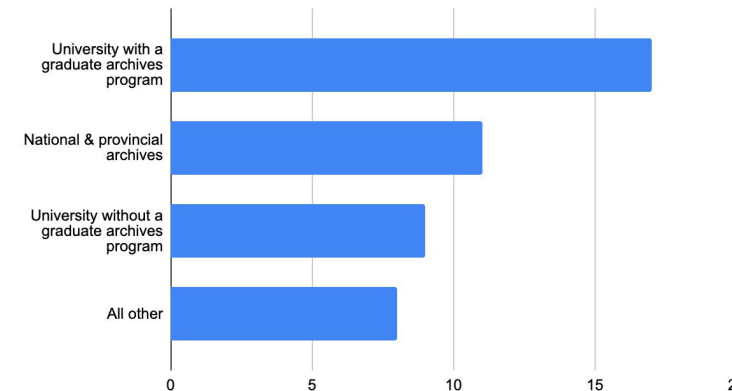
Suggested actions:

Journals in archival studies should explicitly encourage submissions from first-time authors, and from people working in geographically underrepresented contexts, as well as authors who are underrepresented in other ways.

Conferences should encourage papers and other participation from first-time presenters and people working in geographically underrepresented areas, as well as people who are underrepresented in other ways.

Geographic representation should be considered for nominations and committee makeup by professional associations and similar groups.

Sources of Data: Archivaria: particularly author information from 10 randomly selected issues between 2000 and 2020.
Statistics Canada: definitions of small, medium and large municipalities, and populations based on 2016 census data.
Wikipedia: List of Archives in Canada.

Rural and small-town archives should be included in archival education, possibly via guest lectures and virtual tours.
